This tripped me up because I figured I could just point it to my existing @~/.ssh/id_rsa@, and it didn't work (in Windows with Cygwin + OpenSSH client and server already installed). Recommended possible fixes: * A small note in the SSH Credentials dialog box indicating the required format		
	* A hyperlink in the SSH Credentials dialog box pointing to details help for setting up an SSH tunnel
