

## Smuxi Issues [FROZEN ARCHIVE] - Bug # 1031: SSH Credentials screen does not explain that keyfile must be PuTTY format

<b>Subject:</b>	SSH Credentials screen does not explain that keyfile must be PuTTY format in Windows, OpenSSH in Linux				
<b>Description:</b>	The SSH Credentials screen accepts a private SSH key file for authentication. It does not explain that the format must be PuTTY (.ppk) on a Windows client and OpenSSH on a Linux client.  This tripped me up because I figured I could just point it to my existing <code>~/ssh/id_rsa</code> , and it didn't work (in Windows with Cygwin + OpenSSH client and server already installed).  Recommended possible fixes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>* A small note in the SSH Credentials dialog box indicating the required format</li><li>* A hyperlink in the SSH Credentials dialog box pointing to details help for setting up an SSH tunnel</li></ul>
